    - i. Berkley BOSS is officially open!
    - ii. Changes to overnight residential parking ordinance are being considered; no changes have been approved at this time. Removal of overnight restrictions is not being considered. Residential parking updates: the existing parking ordinance is being updated to include an online option to apply for overnight parking permits, a modification of the parking restriction times (No parking 2:00 -6:00 am 2:00 5:00 am) and a potential hardship option for annual parking passes for residents. NO CHANGES have been formally approved at this time. Second reading of the ordinance will occur at the next council meeting in July. Council has requested that staff come back with a list of recommendations on how a potential hardship option could be handled.
    - iii. 'The Columbia' PUD: Multi-family housing unit received approval for PUD variances and can proceed.
    - iv. City Hall honors Berkley female trailblazers: Three conference rooms in City Hall have been named after historical Berkley women.
    - v. Millage: a conversation was had to discuss the short-term future of a millage proposal; there are no plans to move forward with a millage at this time.
    - vi. City Manager Search: the official search will kick off the week of July 8th. It is anticipated to last 12-16 weeks.
    - vii. Cardboard Recycling: big success! This is seeing great use and emptied every two weeks.



viii. Budget line item: Has been requested (again). Hopefully with no more imminent personnel transitions we can get this squared away before the fall plant sale.
